INTRODUCTION TO THE DAY

St. Mark's observance of an extended Advent season begins today. Historically, a seven-week Advent season predates the custom of a four-week Advent season. Advent serves as a counterpart to Lent: while Lent helps worshipers prepare for Easter, Advent helps us prepare for Jesus' coming at Christmas. With Christmas items already filling the stores and our surrounding culture rushing toward the holidays, the extended Advent season teaches us to slow down, reflect, and cultivate the spiritual practices of waiting and anticipating.

This year, our Advent theme "Out of Time" orients our observance. Advent thrusts upon us the reality that time is limited. We run out of time to reconcile, to prepare, to make a change. Yet even as we are running out of time, God is outside of time entirely. God's infinite being and infinite patience cut through our fear as God enters human time to dwell with us.







your goodness continued to pour:


in friendship with humanity,

For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.


INVITATION TO COMMUNION
