INTRODUCTION TO THE DAY

Here is our water of life! Alleluia!


At the river, your beloved child was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit.

Here is our water of life! Alleluia!



THANKSGIVING AT THE TABLE

Holy God, you formed the earth from chaos; you encircled the globe with air; you created fire for warmth and light; you nourished the lands with water. You molded us in your image, and with mercy higher than the mountains, with grace deeper than the seas, you blessed the Israelites and cherished them as your own. That also we, estranged and dying, would be adopted to live in your Spirit, you called to us through the life and death of Jesus.

and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.


INVITATION TO COMMUNION

The risen Christ is made known to us in the breaking of the bread. Come and eat at God's table.


We share communion with wheat and gluten-free wafers, wine, and juice. Everyone is welcome to receive communion, regardless of religious background or age.







